# A MESSAGE FROM THE COMMANDING OFFICER

In this Falcon Parade State message, I want to provide you with a snapshot of current and upcoming Regimental activities.

This past summer was busy, with our soldiers concentrating on completing individual training courses and participating in collective training with both the Regular and Reserve Force. I am happy to say that all Highlanders, sent on their junior leadership training, were successful in completing

their courses and we now have six new Master Corporals. In addition, our soldiers gained invaluable collective training experience from the section to brigade level, as participants in 2Canadian Mobile Brigade Group's Exercise MAPLE RESOLVE 2017 at Wainwright Alberta and the 32Canadian Brigade Group's 48th Highlander led Exercise STALWART WARRIOR 2017 at Canadian Training Centre Meaford Ontario.

The Unit began the new training year on September 9, 2017, with a focus on defensive operations and maintenance of baseline IBTS and section live fire qualifications. As an Active Reserve Infantry Battalion, our priorities for this fall will include the completion of baseline training to ensure that our soldiers are deployable, continuing the Unit's expansion as part of strengthening the Army Reserve and conducting key Regimental events as part of our footprint in the community.

Our expansion plan continues to move forward and we expect to receive more than fifty new recruits this year and generate up to ten new MCpls next summer.

Key Regimental events this fall include our Remembrance Day Parade, a Change of RSM Parade, a Change of Honorary Colonel / Honorary Lieutenant Colonel Parade and participating in the St. Andrew's Ball.

With these key events in mind, I would like to take the opportunity to thank both our Honorary Colonel Elms and RSM Murphy for their dedication and service to the Regiment.

HCol Elms is a true highlander. He started his military career as a piper in the Regiment and never forgot his regimental roots during his long and distinguished career in the Regular Force. It has been a pleasure and honour having him serve as both our HLCol and HCol. HCol Elms' knowledge, advice and support has been invaluable to the Regiment.

CWO Murphy has played a significant role in our Regiment. The RSM came to us having previously served as RSM of the Lorne Scots and 32CBG Battle School. He was quick to embrace the Regiment and the Regiment was quick to embrace him. RSM Murphy is a doer by nature. He has enabled the success of many of our Regimental projects and has set the Regiment on an NCO development path which will benefit us for many years to come. It has been a pleasure and honour to work with him.

Both the change of HCol and change of RSM are significant events in the life of a unit. I would encourage all members of the Regimental Family to attend these events and thank the HCol and RSM for their service to Canada and the 48th Highlanders.





#### LEGION FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Grants (through the Poppy Trust Fund) are available for food, heating, clothing, prescription medication, medical appliances and equipment, essential home repairs and emergency shelter or assistance. #### **CF1 CARD - CF APPRECIATION PROGRAM**

The CF1 Card is available to all Canadian Forces members, as well as veterans. It provides a variety of discounts to Canadian military personnel and their families. 
