NEWDIGATE	1		Gas hut opened in Stanway House and Bn paraded for test of respirators. Companies carried on with Training Syllabus (I) and with practice Air Raid (II).
	2		Personnel continued going through Gas Hut. Route march reduced to coy march of 9 miles under company arrangements in view of the Bn going on 1 hour's notice to move.
	3		C.O., Adjt., I.O., Coy and Pl. Comdrs went to REIGATE area to watch R.C.R. in scheme with tanks. Remainder of Bn carried on with training in accordance with syllabus. No personnel were allowed out on pass on account of the Bn being on one hour's notice to move.
	4		BHQ, C and A coys paraded to Divine Service in the field at head of University Ave. at 0915 hrs. B and HQ coys paraded at 1015 hrs. D coy paraded to the Church of England in NEWDIGATE at 1100 hrs. One bus load per coy were allowed in to HORSHAM in the afternoon and another bus load at night.
	5		The Bn paraded to CUCKSEY FARM area in accordance with orders and carried out practice attack with tanks in accordance with orders. On completion of the scheme Major-General Pearkes addressed the Bn for the first time. He stated that this scheme was a practice of what this Bn could expect to do in reality shortly. The Bn returned to the area at about 1600 hrs. Major Southam and Capt Armstrong reconnoitred a new area near HIGHGATE and a route to MARGATE at the request of HQ 1 Cdn Inf Bde.
	6		Companies went on a route march during the morning and returned for lunch and bathing parade to Mobile Baths in the afternoon. Major Southam made a further reconnaissance for the HIGHGATE area.
	7		0800 - 0830 hrs P.T. 0900 - 0950 hrs Precision drill 1200 - 1100 hrs Section Leading 1100 - 1200 hrs Coy Comdrs criticisms of scheme 1200 hrs Dinner. The Bn moved to CUCKSEY FARM area during the afternoon in accordance with movement order and carried on with little schemes with tanks. The movement order was a departure from the normal as it endeavored to do away with cumbersome Bn moves by substituting small quick company movements.

NEWDIGATE	8		0800 - 0830 hrs P.F. 0900 - 0950 hrs Squad Drill 1000 - 1100 hrs Small Arms Trng. Between 1000 and 1100 hrs a notice was sent to each company ordering it to go to parachute area on a practice move. Coys carried on with sports during the afternoon, while HQ coy went to the Devil's Punchbowl near BRIGHTON on a picnic.
	9		The Bn went on an 18 mile route march during the day, being the longest march yet made by this Bn in ENGLAND. Lunch was sent to the Bn by truck. The Bn went on one hour's notice to move at 2400 hrs. "C" coy went to CUCKSEY FARM area during the afternoon to act as mopping up company for H.& P.E.Regt. attack at dawn.
	10		Coys organized for scheme during the morning. Lunch at 1130 hrs. The Bn moved to CUCKSEY FARM area during the afternoon in accordance with orders and bivouaced in woods for the night Brigadier's Recce Gp 1800 hrs, C.O.'s Recce Gp 1900 hrs. The Bn was issued with yellow recognition signals at 1930 hrs.
	11		The attack with tanks commenced at 0500 hrs and was carried out in accordance with orders. General Pearkes was with the left flank and was not pleased with several points. The first objective was reached on the left ahead of time, but the right was held up by gas for some time. Both flanks finally got through to the second objective, but the attack had rather petered out by that time owing to BHQ being in a poor O.P. and the C.O. having been called away by the General which was taken as a signal that the attack was over. The Bn returned to camp for dinner and was confined for the rest of the day owing to one hour's notice.
	12		The Bn carried on with general training during the day. At night a concert was put on for the benefit of the troops, in the NEWDIGATE village Hall by some of the local inhabitants.
	13		Companies carried on with general training during the day. The wearing of respirators for a set period daily was introduced. During the afternoon there was an air raid 'Red' at 1600 hrs, but no message was received until about 1730 hrs so troops stayed in slit trenches during that period. There was also a warning of short duration during the morning being the

	14		Training in the morning - Pay and bathing parades during the afternoon
	15		The Bn moved in Bde scheme in accordance with orders (App 23,24,25,26) The move was smooth and on arrival at Ford Manor the debussing was carried out perfectly to the expressed satisfaction of Gen. Pearkes who was watching. After debussing the Bn marched with A Ech transport to its assembly area at Stonewall Court. The march was slow as our debussing had been fast and the battalions ahead had to stretch out to proper distance. On arrival at the Assembly Area the order for return was received from Bde. The return trip was held up by some confusion at the starting point before arrival of the head of our column. On the return trip the Bn witnessed its first big air battle. Just as the head of the column approached NEWDIGATE forty planes could be seen overhead. A whistling time bomb landed in a field near the C.O.'s car and was reported. Several planes were seen to fall in flames. Capt. Crawford-Brown who was umpiring a scheme of the 2nd Bde witnessed the capture of a German pilot who baled out. A party of about 120 men under Captain K.F. Whyte left for LYDD RANGES during the afternoon. They were supposed to leave at 1500 hrs, but due to an air raid warning did not leave until after 1700 hrs which meant that they did not reach LYDD until after blackout.
	16		Companies carried on with training in accordance with syllabus.
	17		Companies carried on with training in accordance with syllabus.
	18		Church parade as usual during the morning. The party from LYDD under Capt. Whyte returned, reporting the shooting down of an enemy aircraft by Pte. Clarke. Copy of Capt. Whyte's report attached. Letter from Gen. McNaughton attached App.31
	19		The Bde Infantry own Tank scheme scheduled for this day was cancelled. The Bn went on one hour's notice to move at 1200 hrs.

NEWDIGATE	21		The officers entertained at dinner in "A" Mess for 10 replacement officers from BORDON being Lyons, Aird, Beatty, Campbell, Defries, Clarke, Deeks, Banton, Proctor, and Leadbeater. Coys. bathed at Mobile Baths during afternoon and spent rest of time at sports. B Coy played baseball against a team from the Artillery. Training in morning was in accordance with syllabus.
	22		The Bn came off 1 hour's notice to move at 1200 hrs. Companies carried on with training in accordance with syllabus.
	23		The Companies carried on with training during the day and as messages were received proceeded to parachute scheme.
	24		There was an air raid during the night during which a whistling bomb was heard to land in the R.C.R. area. It was later reported that several men had been killed. There was several other raids during the day. Companies carried on with training during the day. A and B companies doing Inf cum Tank exercise. 10% effective strength granted weekend leave.
	25		The companies paraded for church as usual during the morning. Coy Comdrs used A Mess for meeting at 1100 hrs and reconnoitred Assembly areas for Mondays scheme during the afternoon. At about 2110 hrs another whistling bomb was heard which was later reported to have landed in the same place in the R.C.R. area, wounding several men of the P.P.C.L.I. who had come to investigate the crater made the night before. The landing of this bomb preceded the warning as was the case the night before.
	26		The Bn moved to the HORNE area for Infantry cum Tank scheme in accordance with orders. C.O. and Adjt moved in the Brigadier's Recce Cp and received his preliminary orders at 1600 hrs. The C.O. made his recce and received the Brigadier's final orders at 1800 hrs. The C.O. met his Coy Comdrs at 1900 hrs and climbed the Windmill at OURWOOD with them to see the area. He gave orders at 1930 hrs following which the Coy Comdrs made their recces. The move up of the Bn had been delayed by an air raid "Red" for half an hour prior to start. The coys bivouacked in various areas near HORNE, A. and D coys having come under command the R.C.R. and the H. & P.E. respectively. There was considerable air activity during the night.

NEWDIGATE	26	Cont.	Capt. Mackenzie showed Col. Haldenby a clipping from a paper saying that he and Colonel Colquhoun P.F.C.I.I. were returning to CANADA for executive positions with the 3rd Division.
	27		The Bn was fed a hot meal at about 0330 hrs and stood to awaiting orders. The C.O. moved to Bde H.Q. at 0430 hrs where he met Gen. Pearkes who confirmed the news of his return to CANADA and told him he would command a Bde and that Major Southam would command the Bn. At 0830 hrs the Brigadier decided that the R.C.R. on the right were held up and went forward. The C.O. with Lt.-Col. Simmonds went forward to the R.C.R. Headquarters near LODGE FARM, where the Brigadier gave his orders for an attack. The C.O. met his "O" Gp at 0930 hrs and ordered an advance on the left to the final objective which had been taken by the H & P.E. and an attack across the R.C.R. point in the right, the zero hour being set for 1045 hrs. The attack was carried out to the satisfaction of all concerned, and the coys commenced to dig in. At about 1230 hrs the "Cease Fire" was blown and the coys had lunch. At about 1300 hrs a message giving order for the return was received and the Bn met busses at OUTWOOD and returned to the vie bivouac area.
	28		The Bn went on one hour's notice to move at 1200 hrs. There was a meeting of C.O.'s, 2 i/c's and Coy Comdrs at Bde H.Q. at 1100 hrs to discuss the Inf Gun Tank scheme. Companies carried on with training during the day. The officers and ex-officers of the regiment tendered a dinner for Lt.-Col. Haldenby at night, which was attended by Brigadier Smith and The B.M. Two air Raid warnings were received during the dinner. Transport warrants for the 2nd privilege leave were received and the first personnel sent off. Coys paraded for bathing during the afternoon.
	29		Companies carried on with training during the day. There was considerable air activity during the day and a considerable time was spent in slit trenches.
	30		The Bn paraded on Duke's Rd at 0915 hrs with personnel from Bde HQ and the 48th Tp of 1 Cdn Recce Sqn present. The parade was called up by Major Hendrie and handed over to Col. Haldenby who spoke to the men. He told the men that his promotion was a compliment to the Bn as it indicated he had commanded an efficient Bn and he asked the men to support Major Southam as they had supported him. He then handed over to Major Southam who called for three cheers for Col. Haldenby who then took the march past before the Bn dispersed to its coy areas.

NEWDIGATE	30	Cont.	<p>At about 1100 hrs there was an air raid warning "Red" and shortly afterwards two planes were seen to fall and four parachutists were seen to come down. C coy was on a route march in the area, so P.S.M. Miller's platoon was sent after a parachutist that turned out to be a German ast who was taken prisoner and sent to 1 Cdn Div with P.S.M. Miller for examination. P.S.M. Osborne's platoon followed a German bomber which was forced down. They drove their 15 out too close to the plane which exploded and set fire to the truck destroying it and a lot of ammunition and guns which was loaded on the truck. P.S.M. Lamb's platoon was sent out to guard the three planes that came down in the area but were relieved either by the L.D.V's or the East Surries by 1700 hrs. There were three other raids during the afternoon during the last of which Capt. Crawford-Brown and 5 men set out to chase a parachute that turned out to be an escaped balloon. There was a further raid warning at about 2100 hrs at night, that turned out to be a Brigade warning only, not recognized by the civilians even though the bombs could be heard. On account of this warning the transport move planned for 2400 hrs was postponed to 0045 hrs.</p>

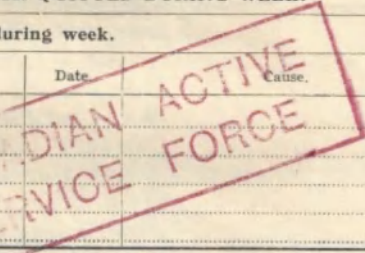
