AUCHINLECK Ayrshire	1 June 43		C.O. attended Bde. Comd. Conference held at H. & P.E. Bn. H.Q. Lt. Cameron took a convoy of 4 A/Tk guns down to join the main convoy at CARLISLE. He, along with his vehicles, was expertly camouflaged with Khaki puttees, khaki tie, a cap F.S. of dubious ancestry and a complete lack of any badges save pipe, and only his raucous cry for whiskey on his return saved him from being mistaken for an alien. Coys. carried out individual training syllabus during the day. "In Which We Serve" was shown in the Mess in the evening, brilliantly emphasizing the point that the Army alone does not bear the brunt of the fighting. Weather - Mild and clear.	PR
	2 June 43		C.O. briefed Cpl. Hatton who proceeded to CARLISLE with 2 3" mortar vehicles to join their convoy. C.S.M. Crossley's M.C.O. School got under way yesterday for the umpteenth time and is now in full swing. Coys. carried out training syllabus all day and in evening "B" and "D" Coys. set out for the River AYR for a night assault landing on unknown ground. "B" Coy. completed the Exercise by 0600 hrs. but "D" Coy. owing to a slight miscalculation did not land and will continue later. Weather - mild and clear.	PR
	3 June 43		C.O. attended a conference at Bde. all morning. Two convoys left to-day. The first under Comd. Lt. Maylor for BIRKENHEAD by rail, and the second with Sgt. Pennycook by road for CARLISLE. All went unrecognizable as Highlanders - a depressing thought but a sacrifice made in the interests of security. The Coys. blanced heavily in the morning for the Bde Inspection to-morrow. In the afternoon a practice ceremonial parade was held, the Bn. being divided into 12 Pls. of equal size. This odd formation called for peculiar ceremonial and commands that taxed the ingenuity of the Commanders. However, the arms drill was smart and by the end of the afternoon all the problems had been ironed out. Weather fair and warm.	PR MAY

AUCHINLECK Ayrshire	4 June 43		Rising at 0430 hrs. the Bn. formed itself into 12 equal Pls. and moved off to a Bde. parade ground arriving at 0900 hrs. The Brigade Group was then collected and formed up en masse and at precisely 1000 hrs. Maj.-Gen. Simonds, G.O.C. 1 Cdn. Div. stepped out of his Buick onto the field. The 48th Pipe Band played the General Salute and helped throughout the inspection and the march past to alleviate the effects produced by the frantic tintinabulations of a very discordant R.C.R. Band. The whole inspection and March Past passed off in less than 1 1/2 hrs. without incident. The Bn. then marched home, whilst the Officers after a hurried sandwich lunch, proceeded to KILMARNOCK to hear an address by the G.O.C. H.Q. had great difficulty landing, two men nearly drowned, one of which was taken to a Civilian hospital, the other back to ship. Lt. Honour, Padre and Capt. Whitelaw played prominent parts in rescue. Scheme therefore was not very successful particularly as C.O. landed very late and rejoined Bn. just before 'Cease Fire' which was 1000 hrs. Troops then marched to embarking point in heavy rain and after several delays embarked in L.C.T. and proceeded out to ship. Heavy weather hindered the operation so troops not on board until 1545 hrs., without loss. All ranks given a tot of rum and remainder of day devoted to thawing and drying. 4. MAIL - ADDRESSES:

Correspondence posted by personnel of the Canadian Army Overseas for delivery in Canada and mailed under the free postage concession granted to members of the Canadian Armed Forces MUST bear the endorsement "C.A.A.F." on the face of the envelope near the top.

Unit Censorship - Unit censorship is imposed when considered necessary in a theatre of war. The following provisions will strictly be adhered to when unit censorship is imposed:-

Postcards - Only the writers regimental number, rank and name may appear on a postcard or gift acknowledgment card. The writers unit must NOT be given.

Letters - Only the writers regimental number, rank and name may appear on the back of the envelope or in the letter itself.

Green Envelopes - Where the writer avails himself of the privilege of using green envelopes the addresses of which are not subject to unit censorship, he will NOT write his number, rank, name or unit on the green envelope itself. He will write his number, rank and name only on the back of the envelope addressed in the green envelope. The certificate on the front of the envelope will be signed in the usual manner.

5. PRINTED COTTON PATCHES AND TITLES - INSTRUCTIONS

Patches and titles of the printed cotton type are of substantial construction and are guaranteed not to fade or lose their shape. The edges of the patches and titles are sealed to prevent fraying, and it is therefore most important that the edges are not trimmed, as this destroys the edge sealing and permits fraying of the duplex material.

6. MOVIES

Internal alleyways on "C" Deck aft of S.H.O.'s cabin and "D" Deck aft and on "D" Deck aft of the S.H.O. Mess Deck are out of bounds to other ranks not on duty. The purser's Mess and Saloon entrance are also out of bounds to some personnel.

The only exceptions to the above is that other ranks are permitted to visit Barber's Shop and "troops" library during hours laid down.

There will be NO loitering around loudspeakers in alleyways.
