(near) LUCERA, ITALY	I Oct. 43		Reveille ordinary. Bn. debussed 0845 hrs. and crossed S.P. 0850 hrs. Order of march - D Coy., Bn. H.Q., 4 Pl., C., B., A Coys. F, A and B. Echelons. Route - CAROSA CERIGNOLA, POGGIA, LUCERA, taking up an all round defensive position at M.R. Sheet 163 - 102222. A very slow move due to heavy traffic and slow progress of Jock column. Arrived in area at 1800 hrs. Bn. ordered to move at first light, message coming through at 2900 hrs. Weather - warm.	<i>JS</i>
(near) MOTTA, ITALY	2 Oct. 43	✓	Reveille 0400 hrs., breakfast 0430 hrs. Bn. crossed S.P. 109321 at 0535 hrs. in the following order - 4 Pl., D, C, B, A Coys, F Echelon. A and B Echelon remained in their present location. Moved to area 0121 to await further orders. Shortly after arrival the road was strafed by three M.E. 109's causing one casualty in the Bn. "C" group 0930 hrs. Bn. ordered to move up and establish a firm base on the rd. junction 908230, F Echelon to move upon receiving orders. Order of march - C, D, A, B Coys. The village of MOTTA was being heavily mortared so Bn. debussed two miles East of town and proceeded to within one mile when they were held up due to activity ahead. Two men injured by shrapnel. The Bde. put in an attack, R.C.R. right, H. & P. E.R. left at 1745 hrs. which was successful and the 48th moved in and occupied the town for the night. F, A and B Echelons ordered to join Bn. at 1830 hrs. but were later turned back, one ration truck only going up. Weather - fair.	<i>JS</i> 2



(near) VOLTURARA ITALY	3 Oct. 43	(cont)	<p>However the F.O.O. while manhandling his set up to the Coy position lost his way and Maj. Wallace not being sure of Arty. support postponed his attack. ^{EDM} Coy- Moved from MOTTA by march route at 0715 hrs. after Commanding Officers "O" Group where orders and plan given for advance towards VOLTURARA. Passed through R.C.R. who had captured X Rds. West of MOTTA the previous day. Reached point on the road which came in full view of VOLTURARA, Commanding Officer not having any information as to whether enemy in town or not made a new plan which sent D Coy across country to the left of the road with the idea of cutting off road running out of town. The going was tough as I kept to all the dead ground available, but we reached a good location where we could cover the road completely. Soon after getting the Coy into position orders came over the wireless from Commanding Officer to move on West along the road to SAN MARCO. We started immediately with one pl. from A Coy tailing in behind us, joined later by the rest of A Coy. Moving under cover of brush and river bed we reached a spot where road had been cratered. While Lieut. Wood and I were investigating crater an enemy mortar opened up. It seemed to be very close so I at once made a plan to capture it, sending 17 pl. out as a patrol to locate its position. When a runner came back from Lieut. Wood saying he had located Mortar and a M.G. post, I sent 16 pl. forward to help him. The ground was not favourable to us and both pls. got pinned down by mortar and M.G. fire. By this time Gun and Mortar fire was being brought down along the whole river bed forcing the rest of the Coy along with A and B Coy, who had by this time joined us to keep under cover. After dark I withdrew 16 and 17 pl. Lieut. Boughton, Pte Quinn and Pte Courriere had been wounded by M.G. fire and it was a tough job carrying them out in the rain and darkness along the river bed. The three Coys., then took up a position in a draw on the right of the road on orders from Commanding Officer, where the rest of the night was spent in the rain. Unfortunately while Boughton, Quinn and Courriere were being taken back to the R.A.P. in a Jeep it struck a mine and they were all killed. Weather - Rainy.</p>



(near) VOLTURARA ITALY	3 Oct 43		<p>The Bn. moved out of MOTTA at 0730 hrs. with orders to pass through the H. and P.E. Regt. at the X Rds. 9024, then split, C Coy going East the remainder going West. B Coy remained in reserve the entire day. In the evening the R.A.F. and part of P Ech. moved into VOLTURARA. The detailed accounts of the days actions are given below in the reports submitted by Capt Wright A Coy, Capt Handley C Coy, and Capt Counsell D Coy. "A" Coy- Left MOTTA at 0715 hrs. and marched to X Rds. where C Coy went to the right and A Coy and D Coy went to the left. After moving about one mile down the road the Commanding Officer sent D Coy to cut the road south of VOLTURARA and A Coy to take the town. A Coy moved into the town unopposed. Then 8 pl. cleared the slopes on far side of town while 9 pl. chased a German Mortar off the road beyond. The Coy reassembled on the road and proceeded on behind D Coy. D Coy became pinned by heavy fire of all types and A Coy spent the rest of the day in the shelter of the river bank under very heavy Artillery fire. After dark the Coy moved to the high ground under very disagreeable conditions until the next day. "C" Coy- C Coy lead the Bn. out of MOTTA at about 0730 hrs. Orders were to pass through the H. and P.E.R. at the X Rds. 9024 and proceed East. Under command the company were a Tp. Recce, a Tp. Tanks, 2 Dets. A/T Guns, 2 Dets. 3" Mortars. About 1030 hrs. fire was opened on the Recce about 893257, who returned to cover without loss. Two enemy guns were observed on the saddle connecting SAN MARCO and the X Rds. 8527, while it was thought others were in a sand pit forward of the road. The P.O.O., Capt Foster, established an O.P. well forward and opened troop fire. The enemy guns were forced out and an examination of the position afterwards revealed the enemy guns to have been 75mm's., and also that a truck or trailer had been hit and some equipment destroyed. Meanwhile Maj. Wallace had sent 14 pl. under command of Lieut. Eby around to the right through the hills to try and occupy the high ground above the X Rds. The company was under continuous light shelling, probably 75mm., but no casualties were sustained. About 1200 hrs. enemy were observed on the ground above the X Rds. This was confirmed about 1230 hrs. by a message from Lieut. Eby to the effect that he had observed about 2 pls. of enemy on the forward slope of the MT. CASELLO FEATURE and had 14 pl. take up a position overlooking them on MT. INGOTTA. Capt Foster had by this time registered the enemy position and fired his regiment on it using scale 3. Maj. Wallace had received fresh orders from the Brig. to capture and hold the X Rds. On receipt of the message from 14 pl. he moved the remainder of his coy to the INGOTTA feature and took up a defensive position. He then issued orders for a dawn attack.</p>



(near) VOLTURARA ITALY.	4 Oct 43		<p>Communications between Coys was extremely difficult during the day due to enemy activity. B Coy in reserve still the other three Coy Comds reports. At 1330 hrs. the Coy again crossed the river to create a diversion for the R.C.R.'s. and proceeded to left flank the strong German position. At 1500 hrs. Lieut. Magee reported enemy on the slope in front of him and worked his way above the position and attacked. Clearing the enemy from the position. The pl. then came under very heavy Mortar and M.G. fire. Lieut Magee was wounded and Sjt Walsh took command and initiated an orderly withdrawal and Cpl Ellison and L/Cpl Biel very gallantly stayed and brought their Officer out. The Coy then consolidated and stayed there the night under spasmodic shelling. The Coy lost four men wounded and Lieut Magee. ^{"A"}Coy- Nothing to report until the afternoon. An attack was launched at 1500 hrs. by the troop of tanks and 2 sections of 14 pl. One tank was knocked out by mines on the approach. The attack was successful, the enemy either running from their positions or cowering in the bottom of their weapon pits. About 60 casualties were inflicted on the enemy, while our casualties were, troop sjt of the tanks killed, six men of 14 pl. killed and two wounded. 13 pl., who were to be launched only if success was certain, came under fire of our own tanks and had one man wounded. Withdrawal was accomplished without trouble. ^{"B"}Coy- Commanding Officer gave me orders to advance along the road toward the enemy positions of yesterday. We had hopes they had pulled out during the night, but after proceeding about $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile we were heavily mortared again but were able to get into cover of a draw before too much damage was done. Lieut. Wood was killed while getting his pl. back under cover. The same shell wounded three other men and myself. We remained in this draw until late in the afternoon when we moved up after an attack had been launched by the R.C.R. behind an Artillery barrage which was brought down on the SAN MARCO feature. The attack was successful as the enemy withdrew from the SAN MARCO feature during the night and we moved up and took over the position. Weather - Fair.</p>






(near) VOLTURARA ITALY.	5 Oct. 43		A, C and D Coys. remained in their existing areas. A patrol from B Coy. u/c Lt. Grant reconed the road as far as 840228 and reported area clear of enemy. B.H.Q. and B Coy. moved to area 542231. Periodic shelling during the day but no casualties. Weather - warm.	
(near) VOLTURARA ITALY.	6 Oct. 43		C Coy. moved from its position to a defensive position beside Bn. H.Q. particularly the West flank. The remainder of the Coys. and Bn. H.Q. remained in their positions throughout the day. At 1700 hrs. F, A and B Echelons ordered up, F and A Echelon moving into Bn. H.Q. area, B Echelon moving into rear Bde. H.Q. area about 1000 yds. behind. Periodic shelling by 105mm How, one shell landing beside Bn. H.Q. but caused no damage. The remainder of the shells landed in rear causing damage to Arty. and Engineers. Major I.S. Wallace evacuated with jaundice. Capt. Palmer joined C Coy. and Lt. Arrell transferred from Support to D Coy. Coy. pack trucks brought up after dark. B Coy. sent out two sections at 2300 hrs. to act as covering patrol for an Engineer' working party. Capt. Macintosh brought the latest Intelligence Summary. Weather - warm.	
(near) VOLTURARA ITALY.	7 Oct. 43		Heavy rain the whole day turning Bn. area into a sea of mud making all movement extremely difficult. One M.M.G. Pl. of Bde. Support Group attacked. Lt. George picked up a jeep from D.M.A. 3rd Bde. made steady progress across the river in spite of heavy opposition. Weather - rainy.	
(near) VOLTURARA ITALY.	8 Oct. 43		Bn. ordered to move forward in the morning to attack and consolidate on the feature Pt. 520 Sheet 162 M.R. 7527. "O" group moved off in jeeps at 1115 hrs., the Bn. on foot u/c Major Banton following up. Bn. forming up position 7925. Start point line of road 783265 - 787275. Zero hr. 1430 hrs. Order of attack was A Coy. on the right proceeding across the river then up a draw to a group of houses near of summit of Pt. 520. B Coy. on left crossing the river and up another draw to farm buildings and consolidated. D Coy. followed up B Coy. and advanced directly onto Pt. 520. C Coy. reserve, crossed the river later and took up a defensive position. Attack proceeded without incident, the enemy having withdrawn from feature. Coys. consolidated by 1700 hrs. Advance Bn. H.Q. established in draw at 789262. Night passed without incident except for shelling across the valley. Lts. Clarkson, Reburn, Eby and Bell evacuated with jaundice. A, B and majority of F Echelon remained in present location. Weather - fair.

Periodic shelling on the valley but none in the Bn. area. 4 Pl. sent out two patrols at dawn u/c Lt. Murray. They patrolled to MACCHIA and PIETRACATELLA reporting the former clear of enemy. Upon entering PIETRACATELLA civilians reported the enemy in occupation of the town but on the way back the Germans blew up PIETRACATELLA and apparently withdrew. Capt. Handley evacuated, Capt. McLaren becoming A/O.C. C Coy. Rain during the day. P, A and B Echelons moved up just across the river. Weather - rainy.	<i>AM</i>

(near) CAMPOBASSO ITALY	11 Oct 43		<p>The Commanding Officer left with the Brig. to make a recon of an Assembly area for the Bn., before moving to the attack on CAMPOBASSO, which is to be the Bde's, next objective, returning shortly before lunch. The unit placed on two hours notice to move any time after 1700 hrs. The Coys were moved down from the hills and across the river to positions beside Bn.M.G. Heavy rain during the later part of the afternoon and evening flooded the rivers and washed out the diversions making all movement impossible. Commanding Officer attended "C" group at 1800 hrs., a Bn "C" group being held at 1915 hrs. The move cancelled until the following day and Coys bedded down as best they could in the rain. 16 carriers from third flight arrived, the Commanding Officer decided to keep nine carriers in the Bn and disposed of the rest through D.M.A. and Bde. Capt. Beatty evacuated with jaundice.</p> <p>- Weather - Rainy.</p>	#2 FPL
(near) CAMPOBASSO ITALY	12 Oct 43		<p>The rain abated during the night but the diversions impossible until late morning. Bn moved off in T.C.V.s., in the following order - B, C, D, A, A/tk Guns, and one vehicle per Coy. Remainder of F, A and B Echelon concentrated in B Echelon area, w/c Major Whyte at 782263. Bn moved to concentration area in square 7024 and remained there until 2330 hrs when the approach march to CAMPOBASSO commenced. Major Whyte called up to the Bn as both the Commanding Officer and 2 i/c were not well. In the afternoon the Bn moved up from their position on hill 520, (area, 7526, 7626, 7625, 7825 on sheet 1/1,000, #162 ITALY) to area 7024. There the Brig. ordered the Bde to advance and capture CAMPOBASSO. The plan was for the 48th to lead to a line known as NAPARRE, extending right and left of the T road 582777. The R.C.R. were to then go through the 48th and take CAMPOBASSO. - Weather - Fair and Cloudy.</p>	Fm

(near) CAMPOBASSO ITALY.	13 Oct.	43	<p>The Bn. crossed the start line, rd junction 6823 at 0001 hrs and proceeded to GILDONE 6123. From this point information regarding the enemy was nil. The Commanding Officer decided not to move forward until daylight and he could recon the ground from GILDONE to CAMPOBASSO. At 0630 hrs., the Bn., started forward again with "B" Coy, on the right of the road, "A" Coy, on the left of the road and "C" Coy, straddling the road. A section of R.C.E. accompanied us to sweep the roads, and P.O.'s., from the 2nd FIELD MEDIUMS and AIRBORNE 5.5's., accompanied the leading Coys. To line NAPANEE the advance was uneventful with no sign of the enemy. This line was established at 1100 hrs. P Echelon could not get forward due to a bad blow at 588256. Having established the line, the enemy began to Mortar and shell the advance Coys., and the blow at 588256. Casualties were light. "A" Coy were counter attacked by two Tanks and a German Platoon, but beat this attack off causing at least six German casualties and suffering one casualty. "D" Coy in the meantime, had occupied FERATIANO suffering no casualties, but killing one enemy, capturing two and a staff car. The R.C.R.'s., having suffered casualties due to Mortaring decided not to attack CAMPOBASSO until the next morning. At 2300 hrs., a patrol of 3 men from "C" Coy., headed by Cpl Allen entered CAMPOBASSO - The first troops to enter the city. They were challenged and after a short exchange of shots withdrew. - Weather - Fair.</p>	30 AR
(near) CAMPOBASSO ITALY.	14 Oct.	43	<p>The R.C.R.'s. attacked at 0630 hrs., and by 0800 hrs., the city was declared clear. The 48th then moved to a defensive position in area 5728, 5729, 5828, 5829, 5928 and 5929. During the night, patrols from 4 pl., patrolled to the towns of CAMPODIPIETRO 6228, TORO 6330, SAN GIOVANNI 6232 and MATRICK 5934, finding that the enemy had retired from these towns two nights previously. - Weather - Fair.</p>	AR

The Bn., to remain in the area for a period of ten days for re-equipment and re-organization. Draft of 34 O/R's picked up at the D.M.A. - Weather - fair and cloudy.	<i>JK</i> F 4

(near) CAMPOBASSO, ITALY.	17 Oct		Church parade for all R.C. personnel held at CAMPOBASSO CATHEDRAL, the Brig., taking the salute and the pipe band being in attendance. The march past broadcast by the B.B.C. with a background of shell fire. The N.C.O. school assembled consisting of 28 students. CAMPOBASSO placed in bounds to troops, 15% being allowed in at one time. Town proved to be very dull. The Brig., called in the morning and ordered that A Coy move to the high feature of FERRATEZANO, the move being duly accomplished in the afternoon. D Coy patrol cancelled for 24 hrs. Lt. G.A. Fraser returned from hospital and rejoined C Coy. Major Warren visited the Bn. Pay and muster parade during the day, Capt. (near) CAMPOBASSO ITALY.	18 Oct. 43		<p>Coys. remained in their present positions, "D" Coy. patrol postponed indefinitely. 15% of the men allowed into Campobasso. Some shelling during the day but none in the Bn. Area. N.C.O. School continued. Lt. G.A. Boyle reported as a reinforcement Officer and was posted to A company. C.S.M. Taylor left the Unit probably permanently. "C" Company carried out normal patrols and reported no sign of enemy. "A" Company reported tanks and patrols to the South West of them but upon investigation being made turned out to be part of the Second Bde. Bn. mounted the town guard on Campobasso, consisting of Lt. Hudson and 27 O.R.S. Ceremonial. Weather. - Fair and warm.</p>	#5 G
(near) CAMPOBASSO ITALY	19 Oct. 43		<p>Major Benton as A/C.O held Orderly Room, 15 cases. Coys., devoted the day to clean up and to the issue of battle dress and the calling in of all E.D. kit. A possibility that the Bn. may move the following day to take over the R.C.R. position in CAMPOBASSO as that Battalion is pushing Northwards for about eight miles. Captain MacDonald C.D.C. reported to the Bn. to do all necessary dental work. "B" Company sent out patrols during the evening and reported that everything was quiet. Guard mounting in Town square at 1700hrs, the Band being in attendance. An excellent guard. A large crowd turned out to watch it. Weather - Fair and warm.</p>	AP
CAMPOBASSO ITALY	20 Oct. 43		<p>The B.M. called in at B.H.Q. and reported that the Bn. was to move in the afternoon to CAMPOBASSO. O group at 1000 hrs to decide details of move and the Coy. Comds., and Major Benton went to CAMPOBASSO to liaise with the R.C.R. as to the take-over. Coys marched independently to their new areas after lunch. A.B. & F Ech. moved in the late afternoon.
