	2		Companies carried on with Training Syllabus. (App 2)	
	3		Companies carried on with Training Syllabus. The Bn standing to on one hour's notice to move from 1200 hrs for a period of 3 days.

	7		Companies carried on with Training Syllabus (App2) during the morning. The C.O. reported to Bde H.Q. at 0700 hrs and the Bn stood by for a parachute scheme until about 1500 hrs when word to move to WORTH FOREST area was received.(App4) The Bn got away in good time, debussed under cover and were given verbal orders to take up a position in support by the C.O. B Coy were ordered to attack STANDING HALL area which it did and found no enemy. At about 1700 hrs orders to return were received from Bde.	
	8		The codeword "Cromwell" was received at about 0130 hrs. This did not require immediate action. The Bn paraded for divine service as usual, B.H.Q., A, D, and C Coys at 0915 hrs and the remainder at 1015 hrs. The C.O. attended a conference at Bde at 1100 hrs and was warned of possible impending invasion. The Bn was placed on C.B. and all leave cancelled although no personnel were recalled. Lieut. McMurrick (acting L.O.) reported at 2145 hrs with verbal instructions to pack for a move at 4 hours after 2125 hrs. At 2210 hrs received message "Momentum at 4 hrs after 2300 hrs." Coys were ordered to pack and Lieut Wood detailed as O.C. the T.C.P. at S.P. All prisoners except the pending Court Martial were released. At 2300 hrs received instructions from Staff Captain to stand down for further orders and to consider "Momentum" message as meaning a change of notice from 6 hrs to 4 hrs notice only.

NEWDIGATE	9		Three miles of twisted cable was received to replace cable laid in area. The Brig. came about 1100 hrs to introduce the new Staff Captain, Major MacDonald. He gave instructions that the rear party would consist of three men only. At 1645 hrs Capt. Mackie gave instructions to pack and be ready by nightfall to move on one hour's notice. The surplus stores dump at "Ivy Cottage" was opened and considerable canvas and camp stores, including one blanket were stored. The red warning during the raid over LONDON lasted from 2100 hrs to 0500 hrs.	
	10		A further issue of two miles of cable was received. It rained almost continuously during the day. At 1700 hrs the surplus stores dump was opened for the release of extra canvas and blankets to keep the men warm. At about 2300 hrs Ptes. McCoy, J.P. and Willson, J.J. escaped from detention enclosure. The air raid message 'red' lasted from about 2100 hrs until 0500.	
	11		Companies carried on with training during the day. As personnel were not allowed to leave the area the syllabus as laid down could not be followed.	
	12		Companies carried on with training in the area during the day. (App7) During the morning Capt. Mackie visited the Regiment before leaving for return to CANADA.	
	13		Companies carried on with training during the day within the area. (App7)	
	14		Companies carried on with training during the morning and with sports in the afternoon. Pte. Wilson J.J. was sent in by 1 Cdn Inf Holding Unit after surrender. The C.O. and Major Hendrie attended a meeting of Bde. H.Q. at 2000 hrs when they were instructed that men would not be scattered in billets in parties of less than 10 and that Bde would move to billets anytime after 18 Sept 40. They were also told that if the Bde move to the East after 18 Sept 40 this unit would be in reserved position and would supply traffic control on two routes which were to be recon'd on 15 Sept 40. For the first time since large night raids on LONDON began there was no 'red' warning between 2200 hrs and reveille.	
	15		The Bn paraded to Divine Service as usual with B & H.Q. Coys at 0915 hrs and the balance at 1015. Major King reported to Adv. Div H.Q. at 1100 hrs for instructions and Major Merry, Capt. Mackenzie and Lieut. Parker reported to H.Q. 1 Cdn Inf Bde at 0900 hrs for instructions

NEWDIGATE	15	Cont.	re reece of routes. The Bn played the Recce Sqn at baseball at 1400 hrs score - 48 Highrs 10 Recce Sqn 8. There were two short raid warnings during the morning and one in the afternoon but no action was heard. This was an average during this period. An order was received from Bde at 1855 hrs that 25% of personnel were allowed to go to HORSHAM and another 25% to NEWDIGATE between 1900 hrs and 2200 hrs. This order confirmed everyday until cancelled. A heavy barrage was heard in LONDON again throughout the night, but nothing came near unit area.
	16		A dirty rainy day. Little training could be accomplished. Capt. Warren returned to take over the duties of adjutant and Lieut. Gayley was ordered to goto RICHMOND to replace him. The usual number of air raid warnings were received during the day with a long warning at night during the London raid.
